



## **The Bridge School / ISAAC Teacher-in-Residence Award**

**Program Overview:** This project offers, to an individual from a country with emerging technology innovation, an in-depth internship within The Bridge School program. The Teacher-in-Residence program is a philanthropic award presented bi-annually to an individual by The Bridge School, in collaboration with the International Society for Augmentative and Alternative Communication (ISAAC).

The primary goal of the Teacher-in-Residence program is to assist the candidate in developing a skill base and expertise in the area of augmentative/alternative communication service delivery. This program was developed to bring information about augmentative/alternative forms of communication and assistive technologies to a country where little information or training currently exists.

Candidates who are selected for the program already possess the educational background, professional experience and appropriate licensure/credentialing in their home country to provide services to individuals with disabilities (e.g., special education, speech-language pathology).

Candidates are solicited who currently serve children in special education settings, or who train teachers/therapists to work in these environments. This specialty training opportunity at The Bridge School enables the individual to return to his/her country and promote the use of AAC for children/adults who are currently being underserved.

The primary setting for the Teacher-in-Residence training program is The Bridge School educational program in Hillsborough, California. The eighth Teacher-in-Residence award announcement will be made in April 2012.

**Program Goals:** Through the Teacher-in-Residence program, we hope to:

- Have an impact on the lives of children and adults who cannot verbally communicate and live in countries where knowledge, skill and availability of assistive technologies are only emerging,

- Broaden The Bridge School's training model to work with multicultural populations of teachers, therapists and families,
- Establish collaborations with other organizations working in the area of AAC.

Projected Timeline for 2012-2013 Teacher-in-Residence Award:

December 2011 – Announce the opening of the application process  
March 30, 2012 – Deadline for submission of applications  
May 2012 – Final selection of candidate and announcement of award  
January 2013 – Candidate to arrive at The Bridge School  
July 2013 – Candidate returns to home country

The Teacher-in-Residence will be on-site at The Bridge School for approximately seven (7) months (January to July). In-country follow-up will be scheduled during the 2013-2014 academic year.
